## Rules and Regulations

### DRESSAGE TESTS

The Test must be ridden from memory.

Time Limit. Prix St. Georges Test 1956: 12 minutes. Medium Test 1956: 10 minutes. Elementary Test 1955: 8 minutes.

The stop-watch is started after the rider has saluted the Jury, at the exact moment when the horse moves forward and stopped at the end of the test, when the horse halts and the rider salutes the judges.

For every commenced second in excess of the time allowed there is a penalty of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mark.

Errors. First: 2 marks. Second: 5 marks. Third: Elimination.

Dress. Gentlemen—uniform or hacking costume, silk hat or bowler hat, breeches and boots or riding trousers.

Ladies—jacket, hat, breeches and boots.

Saddlery. The English saddle, a simple double bridle, i.e. bridoon and bit with curb-chain are obligatory, lipstrap optional. (Elementary Test: an ordinary snaffle is permissible. An ordinary snaffle is a plain snaffle with straight bar or not more than one joint. The mouthpiece must be smooth and be of metal). Martingales and bearing, side or running reins of any kind are forbidden as also are bandages, boots or any sort of blinkers. Riding whips are prohibited.

General. The dressage competitions are held under the Rules of the British Horse Society, which comply with the Regulations of the Fédération Equestre International.

## COMBINED TRAINING COMPETITION

**Dressage.** See above, except—Third error: 10 marks. Fourth error: Elimination.

Jumping. With the exception of marks for penalties, the jumping will be judged according to the Rules of the F.E.I. for jumping competitions.

The Course. The maximum length of the course will not exceed 500 yards. It may be irregular with halts, changes of direction, and half-turns. No fence will exceed 4 feet in height or 5 feet in spread. Speed 382 yards (350 metres) per minute.

Markings. The dressage test allows for 200 "good" points.

The penalty points for jumping will be subtracted from those obtained for dressage.

In the event of equality of marks, the competitor with the highest marks in the dressage phase is the winner. If both horses have equal dressage marks, the fastest time in the jumping decides.

Dress. See above.

Saddlery. Optional. All kinds of blinkers and hoods are prohibited.
